

GUIDELINES FOR VIDEO SHOOTING

5 TOP TIPS for recording a good quality video

1. LOCATION

Choose a quiet and bright room, with a clear-coloured background. If this is not possible, pick an outdoor location instead.




2. POSITION

Make sure that you are at least 1 metre away from the wall when recording. You may sit, but never record with your back against a window.

3. EQUIPMENT

You can use a smartphone that has been set at the highest quality setting to record your video, or an HD digital single-lens reflex (DSLR) camera. Use a tripod if you have one.



4. FRAMING

Choose a horizontal, medium close-up frame.

5. AUDIO

Speak clearly and loudly, and take breaks while talking. You can record the audio using your smartphone, or, if you have one, a lavalier microphone.



**And remember, haste makes waste!
Take your time. If you're unsatisfied, repeat
the recording as many times as needed.**
